The awards night on **Tuesday, November 16th, 2010** at the **Burlington Hotel** promises to be a great night when the achievements of the procurement industry will be celebrated.

Entry is free, simple and open – so please enter: we'd love to see you there!



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How to Enter

It is free to enter the National Procurement Awards. All entrants must submit a document of no more than 500 words that covers the key criteria set out for the category they are entering. Carefully read the section that describes the criteria the judges will be using to assess each category and make sure you cover all of these in the submission you prepare. Make sure you focus on good hard information, backed up by solid facts and figures.

While assembling your entry please follow these rules:

- Submission should be no longer than 500 words.
- All projects cited in support of your entries must have been staged within the 12 months prior to the closing date of these awards.
- Please complete the last page of this entry form and insert it as the cover page of your submission.
- Please complete the Trophy Form and return along with your submission.
- Please try to address each of key points that the judges will be looking for and lay out any supporting information – text, tables, graphics etc so that it is easy and clear to understand.

- Please email 2 high quality electronic format (300dpi jpegs) landscape photos relevant to your entry to info@procurementawards.ie, ensuring that there no logos or text visible.
- Please ensure your submission fits onto 5 pages of A4 format (including supporting materials such as pictures, graphs, tables etc) AND the entry form.
- Please send 10 copies of your submission by post to: **The National Procurement Awards, 69 Main Street, Blackrock, Co Dublin.**
- Please do **NOT**: staple or bind your submission, use paper sizes that are not A4, include other materials such as brochures, CDs, DVDs etc. Such additional material will not be accepted.
- Closing date is **September 24th, 2010**- submissions after the closing date may not be accepted.
- You may enter as many categories as you like, however you must submit a separate entry each time.

Judging

Judging for the awards will be under the auspices of the Irish Institute of Purchasing and Material Management, the longest established and largest Institute of procurement professionals in Ireland.

A distinguished panel of Judges will be drawn from state, academic and private sectors and will be co-ordinated by the Institute. **The judges decision is final.**

A number of finalists will be short-listed in each category, and these will be unveiled on our website www.procurementawards.ie and in the Irish Independent. The awards night will be covered by the Irish Independent with photographs of all winners published.

You can enter as many categories as you like, but you must complete a form for each category (last page of this leaflet) and attach 500 word entry for each category you enter separately.

For each submission, please post us 10 copies of your entry. Provide clear, quantitative evidence to support your entry. Please do not submit any additional promotional literature for any of the awards, as your entry will be assembled into packs that are sent to our judges to review before they make their recommendations.

Don't forget: the deadline is September 24th, 2010



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Categories & Criteria

IMPORTANT NOTE: The judges will not be influenced by the size of the firm that enters; small firms are just as likely to win as large multi-nationals.

PLEASE REMEMBER: All activity described in your submission should have happened during the past 12 months from the closing date of these awards.

Procurement Leader

Open to all senior individuals, the Procurement Leader Award is presented to procurement's corporate star. The award showcases an individual's significant contribution to procurement .

The winner can be nominated by themselves or anyone inside or outside their organization or involved in procurement in the wider context that believes the individual concerned has made a significant contribution via their own activities or influence to the advancement of procurement.
